It had a population of 333 at the 2001 Census, rising to 574 at the 2011 Census. Most of the land to the north and east of the village is owned by the National Trust, which runs the Roughley Railway, a narrow gauge railway. A section of the old tramway line from Doncaster to Bawtry is also part of this civil parish. The only house with a gas mantel from pre-First World War days is Hanging Wood. History St Botolph's Church is in the centre of the parish. It is an ancient structure with much of the fabric being from the 13th century. Within the village is the 12th-century St Mary's Church, the 17th-century Church of St James, and the 16th-century St Michael and All Angels Church. This is the site of the Doncaster-York Minster Way, and there is also a Roman villa at Old Roughley, which is on the Bawtry to Doncaster Roman road. The village is mentioned in the Domesday Book as Rougerye. The name has an Old English meaning "Open land where young bulls (or young bullocks) are housed". At the time of the Norman invasion, Roughley belonged to the Gilbert de Ghistelles. Thomas Ghistelle bought Roughley in the 13th century and gave it to Haldimand de Briqueville.
